#### **UCI 'ISLANDS' ITS MICROGRID**



A yearlong collaboration, including Facilities Management, Design & Construction, and the Advance Power & Energy Program (APEP), recently resulted in a major milestone for UCI by successfully islanding the campus power grid. This demonstration of separating the campus power from Southern California Edison (SCE), and carrying the campus power load onto our own Cogeneration Plant is a major first step in enhancing our ability to serve the campus community in the event of an SCE power interruption. We look forward to continued collaboration with our campus research community through the Advanced Power and Energy Program, as we advance toward enhanced power reliability at UCI.

UCI Transportation has negotiated an exclusive deal for the UCI Community to receive \$5,500 off the 2018 Nissan Leaf. ## **EMPLOYEE PROFILES**



#### Ryan Hoadwonic, Director, Institutional Research Operations.

I have worked at UCI for 8 years and have been in my current position for 1 year. I am responsible for managing the day-today Institutional Research operations, including responding to requests for data and providing reports and analyses.

How has UCI/department helped you in your career development?When I first started at UCI, the Office of Institutional Research was very different. In the eight years I've been here, the office has almost tripled in size, which has afforded both me and my colleagues the opportunity to participate in trainings and take classes, attend and present at conferences, and participate in discussions and data exchanges that broaden our understanding of institutional research and its potential.

Who is one colleague that deserves praise and recognition? Why? Honestly, I think that Assistant Vice Chancellor Ryan Cherland should be given praise and recognition. He's completely changed institutional research at the university from what it was when I first got here. Not only that, but he genuinely wants what's best for the university, cares about people, and does the job needed without hesitation. What piece of advice would you give to a new employee? Never assume you know everything and never stop learning. The university constantly changes, which means we need to change and grow in response.
