Dear DFA employees,

As we welcome the arrival of spring, I extend my warm wishes to each and every one of you. Your steadfast commitment and hard work continue to be the foundation of our division's accomplishments, and I am truly inspired by the dedication you bring to your roles. I am pleased to provide updates on two key topics I highlighted back in January: the Campus Budget Framework, and Divisional Strategic Planning.

Campus Budget Framework:

Since the beginning of this month, we've been shifting our focus to refer to the budget framework - which means the budget model is still under construction. We will switch to "budget model" once the model is finalized, vetted, and approved. The budget model itself is a mission-based model, meaning costs are aligned with the campus' mission. Just this week, we announced a campus town hall where campus leadership will outline the proposed missionbased budget framework for academic units. The objectives of the mission-based budget framework are as follows:

- 1. Align resources with UC Irvine's strategic goals and mission.
- 2. Enhance transparency and accountability in financial management.
- 3. Improve resource planning to support the university's core functions and infrastructure.

I encourage you to register for the virtual town hall scheduled on Thursday, April 11 from 11 a.m.-12 p.m.

The development of the budget framework for academic units is actively underway, with the expectation to establish the model based on stakeholder feedback. The launch of the FY25 budget model is projected for the June/July time frame. Non-academic support units (includes DFA) will continue to operate under an incremental budget for FY25, with plans to integrate them into the model in FY26. DFA's Budget & Finance team will be meeting with each department throughout the month of April to prepare for this year's budget cycle.

Divisional Strategic Planning:

On Monday, March 25, we held our second meeting with DFA's Strategic Advisory Network (SAN) members. As a reminder, this team has been established to help drive the development, communication, and execution of our strategic plan. We are on target to share DFA's Strategic Plan at the in-person town hall scheduled for May 15 from 10:30 a.m.-1 p.m. During this event, you'll gain insight into various departmental strategic goals, as well as our divisional goals.

Continuous Improvement Tools and Templates: Surveys

DFA's Program Development and Execution (PDE) <u>website</u> features a variety of tools and templates in the areas of process improvement, project management, and change management to support staff in their process improvement projects and efforts.

Tool Spotlight: Surveys

<u>Surveys</u> are one of the main tools for collecting voice of the customer (VOC) data during a process improvement project. Since lean six sigma is focused on reducing waste and providing the right value to the customer, understanding the needs of the customers and what they value is critical. Using relevant questions, surveys can provide us with quantitative data regarding customers' reaction to a product or service and are typically used as part of the analysis of the current state during the plan phase of A3 PDCA methodology. Introducing the DFA Business Office: **Enhancing Efficiency and Support**

The DFA Business Office provides essential business services to all DFA departments, as well as certain support functions to those DFA units without dedicated administrative support. With a focus on fostering synergies and leveraging economies of scale, the Business Office aims to elevate service levels, mitigate risks, and align core business operations with overarching organizational goals.

DFA's Business Office encompasses three primary support functions:

- DFA Budget & Finance: This team is responsible for all <u>budgeting activities across DFA</u>. Working closely with department heads and managers, they ensure alignment with UCI's Budget Office and CFO & Vice Chancellor Mary Lou D. Ortiz, managing budgets effectively and responsibly.
- DFA Business Services: This team supports various administrative services. From managing TRS and payroll activities to handling software purchases and renewals, facilitating departmental purchasing requisitions and reimbursements, and acting as a point of contact for UCPath users, they provide vital support to departments of all sizes. Business process flowcharts are currently in development to streamline operations further.
- DFA Operations & Records: Stephanie Tenney is UC Irvine's records manager and liaises with UCOP to support the proper implementation of UC's records management program and policies here at UCI. She serves as the campus' central point of contact for records-related consultation and inquiries and advises on defensible disposition in accordance with the UC Records Retention Schedule. Additionally, she oversees the maintenance of DFA's policies and delegations.

After conducting engagements sessions with each DFA department over the last two months, the Business Office is committed to confirming and refining its support model.
