Continuous Improvement Focus: UCIPD: Using Documents

DFA's CPI <u>project library</u> features process improvement projects from all DFA departments, including proposed, in progress, and completed.

UCI Police Department recently completed a <u>CPI project</u> that replaced PDF attachments for applicants with Docusign PowerForms, streamlining the process and removing unnecessary manual steps. UCIPD: Using Docusign for Applicant Hiring Documents



Problem: During the hiring process, PDF attachments were sent to applicants,

including False Statement Admonishment, No Feedback Waiver, and

Applicant Contact Information.



Goal: The goal was to move away from PDF attachments and reduce the

manual steps in the process.



Solution: The solution was implemented in November 2024 and included:

- Sending applicants the documents via Docusign using PowerForms to complete.
- Using MS Outlook templates for applicant emails.



Result: The process was streamlined, and unnecessary steps were removed, including copying and parting manages from proving cent amails.

UCI Zoom Privacy and Security

The UCI Zoom Privacy and Security webpage provides best practices for protecting privacy during Zoom sessions. It advises users to disable cameras, use virtual backgrounds, adjust name displays, and be mindful of chat content. Learn about applicable campus privacy, security, and misuse policies, as well as how to set up Zoom to make it more secure and prevent "Zoombombing." These measures help ensure secure and private remote communication.



Text to 9-1-1

Orange County residents can now text 9-1-1 in emergencies, especially beneficial for those who are hearing or speech impaired, or when calling is unsafe. To use this service, enter "911" in the "To" field, provide your location and a brief description of the emergency, and avoid abbreviations or emojis. Remember, calling is preferred when possible, as it provides dispatchers with immediate information.



Sneak Peak! New Look Coming to UCPath Online

Starting in late July, <u>UCPath Online</u> will feature a new, modern look. When you log in to view your paycheck, check your benefits, see your leave balances, or ask a question, you'll notice a more user-friendly design that makes it easier to find the information you need. Additionally, there will be improvements to the benefit confirmation process for open enrollment and life events.

The UCI UCPath team supports UCPath Center Roadmap projects and is collaborating with the systemwide UCPath team and other UC locations on this redesign. The team is currently testing the revised functionality and supporting a smooth rollout for all the July 2025 UCPath Roadmap project changes.

RSS Ergonomic Self-Assessment

The EHS department provides ergonomic evaluation and support services for a variety of work settings to prevent and mitigate repetitive motion, musculoskeletal, and manual material handling injuries. As a part of our efforts to continuously improve this program, EHS has launched a new ergonomic self-assessment tool through Risk and Safety Services (RSS) to replace the Cardinus system. The new RSS tool was developed specifically for the UC system and more closely benchmarks the factors and work tasks relevant to UC employees. It will currently be assigned only to administrative employees in the CX union but is available as an optional tool for non-CX union employees. Administrative employee in the CX union will be redirected to the RSS Self-Assessment website. Non-CX union employees performing administrative or office work, as indicated by their Safety Training Self-Evaluation (STSA), will be directed to complete the Ergonomics Training on UCLC. Additionally, the RSS Ergonomic Self-Assessment is available as a voluntary resource at RSS Ergonomic Self-Assessment.
